Personal Care Home

We are very excited to soon be announcing our "Close to Home" Capital Campaign for our Personal Care Home and Chapel. This has been a long haul in the planning process of filling the gap for our resident needs between Pineview Manor (Assisted Living) and the Mennonite Nursing Home (Long Term Care). Many times staff have been called to emergencies in Pineview to help a resident who is struggling with a health concern or has had a fall—often being a resident that could continue to have quality of life in a Personal Care Home rather than being assessed for Long Term Care.

People living in the Personal Care Home, which will be licensed by the Saskatchewan Ministry of Health, will have additional support including 24 hour caregivers who will assist with personal care, medications, serve meals and provide meaningful activities. This home will welcome people from Country Gardens, Pineview Manor and the surrounding communities. This is about growing the community we already have by providing all the resident needs "Close to Home".

There will be opportunities to donate to our "Close to Home" Capital Campaign. Further information on how to donate will be coming out shortly. All donations will be Charitable Tax receipted.

This is a very exciting adventure as we continue to "Serve God by Serving Others". We have seen the needs first hand as we look to our assisted living and the community and now we are aligning ourselves once again to serve those in need.
